

Our **SUMMER CAMPS** were pel preached; our efforts were met with many challenges, as more than worth the while! they often are. The weekend prior to our teen camp a hurricane blew through NB and knocked out the power for much of the province. I sat down with our volunteers on that Sunday evening and we discussed the possibility of cancelling camp. They unanimously agreed that we could put ourselves to the task of seeing camp through - to spite some of the new challenges we would face. We were very thankful for a donated generator that arrived with some of our Ontario volunteers: of our 6 freezers and 1 fridge full of food, we lost nothing during the 128 hour outage! All of the challenges of running camp sans power were met heartily by our volunteers. All of whom worked diligently to see camp succeed in the face of the challenges and we heard the gos-

We had planned 3 weeks of Junior Camp, but unfortunately due to a lack of committed volunteer staff we were forced to cancel the second week of Junior Camp and revamp some of our scheduling. It can be discouraging to think about it in human terms as a failure - but it certainly does not fall outside of God's Sovereignty and He knows exactly why and with what purpose He saw fit for it to be this way. Our junior camps saw a number of trips to the hospital - the Lord offered His protection and there was no one seriously injured at ANBC last Summer. It's amazing to me to see how God uses what appears to be bad for His own glory. This seemed to be a theme last summer as He taught us to rely on Him in everything. For 2015 we are plan-

ning to have just two weeks of Junior Camp, if we are able to fully staff these weeks we will consider adding another week back into the schedule again in the future.

There are lots of opportunities to **VOLUNTEER** here during any of our camps. Whether vou're 13 and would like to serve on our dish crew or are in your 70's and would like to serve as a cabin leader or on janitorial, the Lord has used people for His glory in these ways here at Arrowhead, and we'd love for you to consider ioining us in some capacity this coming summer. Specifically we require a second *lifequard* for our waterfront for the three weeks of on site camp; this volunteer will require waterfront training, we can help with additional training if that is necessarv. Last summer we had no lifequard and were unable to offer our waterfront to the campers - we'd love to overcome that hurdle this summer. We also require a camp medic for all three weeks of our on site camps as well; this volunteer should have first responder training or better. A vital role that we often have difficulty filling is our cabin leader position. As the camp manager here. I like to encourage adults in their 20's to 40's to consider this position. It often takes people out of our comfort zones. but having a mature Christian offering leadership in the cabin has proven to have dramatic positive results. So, maybe you've thought about it and think you're too old, or it would be too hard - but believe me when I tell you that even when we feel inadequate that God is

able. Each week of on site camp we should have 12 individuals ready to serve as cabin leaders, seldom is this the case. There are numerous *support roles* as well that require people of all skill levels; crafts, games, activities, cleaning, teaching, drama, leadership, kitchen, maintenance, dishes... we even need someone to run the pit BBQ on Wednesdays!

We're very excited about this coming year and what it will bring. And as always we would ask that you join with us in **PRAYER** for the ministries that will be happening here at Arrowhead Native Bible Center this year. Please pray for the volunteers that are coming, that they would be even now preparing their hearts for ministry. That the Lord would protect them from the adversity of the world. Pray for those campers that will come, that they too will already have the Holy Spirit preparing them to hear and understand the gospel. Please also pray for safety for both our on site camps and for those events that will see us traveling with volunteers and campers.

Arrowhead is a ministry that operates on the labours of volunteers who come and serve the Lord in any number of ways. Without the gospel focused, obedient, servants of God that come here to see our summer camps come to life we would not see this ministry thrive. It is a sacrifice to give up a week (or more) of your summer to volunteer at summer camp, but it is not a sacrifice that you will find yourself regretting!
