Hello young people! We are excited that you are interested in helping at Pine Ridge Bible Camp this summer! Before you fill out the application for the LITe program, we want to tell you a little bit about what LITe is all about.

What is it? LIT stands for Leaders in Training. We know that God made each of you with abilities and skills - and ultimately with a purpose. Through this program, we want to help you learn to use these skills, and to grow in leadership, communication, and responsibility. Most importantly we want to help you to grow in your relationship with God who made you and wants to be your guide through this often crazy life.

Why LITe? The Bible talks a lot about light. Right from Genesis when God said “Let there be light” and there was light! (Genesis 1:3). In the Bible, darkness is often used as a picture of sin and wrong. In John 12:46 Jesus said *“I have come as a light to shine in this dark world, so that all who put their trust in me will no longer remain in the dark.”*

God is light, and when we know God as our Savior from our sins (darkness), then we live in His light and truth. God wants us to show His light to others around us through how we live and what we say. Here is a word picture that Jesus used to describe this:

“You are the light of the world—like a city on a hilltop that cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp and then puts it under a basket. Instead, a lamp is placed on a stand, where it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your good deeds shine out for all to see, so that everyone will praise your heavenly Father” (Matthew 5:14-16).

What will you be doing? As a Leader In Training, you are coming to serve at the camp in a very important support role. Your jobs will include kitchen help, maintenance, cleaning, work projects, helping with camp activities and skills, etc. We will also spend some great times doing activities together and talking about important things in life. Not to scare you off, but remember when you come that you are here to learn and serve, not for a week of holidays :)

We hope that your experience here will be fun, challenging, and rewarding, and that you will grow in leadership skills and in your relationship with God!

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Modesty Standard

NCEM Bible Camps have a modesty standard which staff are expected to uphold. *This standard is intended to protect each staff member and also to set a good example for the campers.* We expect all clothing worn at camp, including weekends, to meet these standards. Staff wearing inappropriate clothing will be asked to change. *Please keep this in mind when you pack so you will have enough appropriate clothing to wear at camp.*

Some examples of what we believe to be inappropriate clothing are listed below. This list is not intended to be exhaustive, but it will give staff a guideline for when packing.

Inappropriate clothing for men:

- tight swimsuits
- spandex biking shorts or pants
- shorts which are overly baggy in the legs
- clothing with holes in inappropriate places
- if the only pants you own don't cover your rear end, then please wear a shirt that covers that part of your body in all situations)

Inappropriate clothing for women:

- two-piece or skimpy swim wear
- spandex biking shorts or pants
- leggings
- shorts which are overly baggy in the legs
- clothing with holes in inappropriate places
- bare midriff (bottoms of tops must meet tops of bottoms)
- tops that are too tight or have spaghetti straps
- shorts that are too short, or tops that are too low

By following the above requirements, you will be demonstrating a standard of modesty to other staff and campers which NCEM believes is honoring to the Lord.

Statement of Commitment

Please check each statement which you are willing to obey.

- I am willing to serve faithfully at the jobs given me, to come on time to work, and not leave until my supervisor tells me I can go.
- I will honor God with my mouth (no bad language), with what I watch & listen to (clean movies & music), and with my body (no bullying, no physical aggression towards other staff or campers).
- I agree to abide by the modesty standard outlined.
- I will obey all camp rules for staff and campers (failure to comply could result in early dismissal).
- I will not smoke or use drugs or alcohol while serving at camp.
- I will attend each entire evening chapel (and morning chapel when asked by leaders).
- I will respect my LITe leaders and I will attend all meetings/sessions scheduled by them.
