Are you excited about what God is doing? Do you want to be a part of His work? Then we might have a great opportunity for you!

Radio or Podcasting?

We have had a vision for some time to have a radio ministry here at Arrowhead. In pursuit of investigating the potential for a radio station, we looked at the potential to serve as a repeater station. After some investigation, we found that this option would not allow us the opportunity to share any great quantity of local content. It is not simply our desire to have radio ministry for its own sake. Our goal is to have the Bible read on air in Mi'kmag, Maliseet and French. We want to offer lo-

cal testimonies and devotionals. current events and issues affecting our own local communities. Our goal is to have the Gospel available in homes, in businesses and personally to those who may not have a direct Gospel witness at this time.

With all of that in mind, we have adjusted our plans somewhat. We still maintain a vision for a radio station ministry. However, we are going to begin by launching three programs. These programs will be made available via the internet and podcasting as well as to local Christian radio stations.

The first two programs will be 35-45 minutes in length but serve vastly different audiences. One will be evangelistic and focused solely on outreach, the second will serve a similar function as the Circle Summit conferences and strive to answer questions that arise from those wishing to engage in cross-cultural ministry. The third program will be 15-20 minutes in length and will be apologetic in nature. We will examine current social events and discuss what our response to those events should be as Christians.

We are excited about the opportunity to develop this ministry and hope to see the programs launched in early 2019.
