The word "camping" most likely brings thoughts of summer. It's true that is when most of NCEM's Bible camps are held, but we've also begun holding wilderness camps during winter's sub-zero temperatures!

us purchase some heavy sleeping bags and an additional 16x20-foot "prospector" tent (which includes a woodburning stove).

"We have been able to expand our camping program with this equipment, using it for men's and teen camps in Saskatchewan and Alberta," reports missionary Tom Cnossen, who leads NCEM's Higher Challenge Wilderness Adventures.

"Almost every Sunday I have teens coming up to me in church asking about camp," he says. "Now we can tell them that they don't have to wait till summer, but they can join our camps in December and March. I've noticed that they love getting out in God's beautiful creation no matter what season!"

Tom reports that, in addition to teens, as they expand ministry at Maskwacis, Alberta, they are reaching adult men this way. These fellows enjoy camping, as well, especially if it includes ice fishing. "Of course, anytime we are with men or teens, we have

opportunity to tell them more about the story of Jesus and the abundant life He promises those who put their trust in Him."

Besides outdoor equipment, Minute-Man funds have also helped provide for Camp vehicles, says Tom. Higher Challenge vans have to travel on some pretty rough roads, and lately there have been necessary repairs. Tom can't help but also thank the Lord that, along with funds, He has provided a new missionary partner (member of a sister mission) who is a mechanic!

## STILL OUR GREATEST RESOURCE

The conference ... reminded us that the Bible is the greatest source of counsel we can ever have."
