PINE RIDGE BUILDING PROJECT LAUNCHED

Part of our Minute-Man Call sent out a year ago (#160) went towards a building project at Pine Ridge Bible Camp in northwestern Saskatchewan. We'd like to update you on how

things are progressing.

From that Call, \$53,795.32 was raised. The project has received other donations as well (besides Minute-Man). To date, \$158,888.22 has been received in total. We praise the Lord for these funds which have enabled the launching of this project. We look forward in faith to its completion, with a total projected cost to be over \$500,000.

This recent site photo (to the right) may look like nothing has happened yet, but it has! We've been busy with preliminary floor plans, building proposals & permissions by Regional Lands Manager, public health review (for kitchen plans), floor plans finalized and sent for drafting, building material estimates, electrical capacity modifications ... and more.

"If funds continue to come in and things continue to fall into place, Lord willing, we will be breaking ground as soon as the frost comes up in spring of 2020," reports Pine Ridge director, Tabitha Wahlstrom. "Completion of

framing and all the inside work will happen depending on continued fund-ing."

A look at Pine Ridge's present facilities shows how badly this new building is needed. The dining hall and chapel are log structures built in the early 1970s. The chapel is "propped

up" to keep it from meeting the ground, and the dining hall/kitchen is a very tight space, and not meeting public health standards. Neither building is usable in the winter.

The real reason this project is important, of course, is the people who are being reached with the Gospel. Every summer at least 250 campers attend Pine Ridge. "Besides the campers there are numerous teenaged 'Leaders in Training' (LITs). We are thankful to be

able to minister to each of these young lives!" says Tabitha.

This new building will enhance follow-up and discipling throughout the year.

"Many of our campers, LITs, and some of our summer staff don't have support of believers back home," notes Tabitha. "We would love to see more events that will help them grow in their walk with God.

"Ultimately our desire is that the new dining hall/chapel will carry on the legacy of proclaiming God's name, and being a place where His love and truth are evident."
